Changes to Receipt of Proposals

RFP Selection Process Section 2, (RFP Page 3)

The requirement to submit a Contractor Safety Pre-Qualification Form is being replaced with a Bidders Pre-Qualification Form. The Bidder's Qualifications Form is added to the Proposal Format.

Changes to PON cabinet locations

Owner has decided to REMOVE from this RFP the requirement for the contractor to install or prep the cabinet site for each cabinet. Instead, Contractor will place a 30x48x36 handhole, with three ducts running from that handhole to a stub-up location approximately 10ft from the handhole.

Appendix A has been updated to:

- Remove BSDO and BM73 units
- Add BHF(30X48X36) qty 9
- Add Mobilization qty 1

Appendix C has been updated to:

- Remove BSDO and BM73 units
- Add BHF(30X48X36): Buried Handhole for fiber optic systems. Concrete Polymer HH with TIER 22 Traffic rated Lid. Contractor shall include in this item the cost of installing the handhole with one 1.5" duct and two 2.5" ducts run from handhole to a location to be specified that is approximately 10ft from the handhole. Ducts are to be stubbed up 12" above grade and sealed at both ends.
- Add Mobilization: Any costs associated with pre-construction mobilization, to the extent they
 are not reflected in per-unit prices

Clarification to Appendix A: Compliance with Laws and Regulations

Illinois Works Jobs Program Act (30 ILCS 559/20-1 et seq.).

Changes to Appendix B - Compliance with Laws and Regulations

Added:

Boring Compliance

Contractor shall refer to each governing municipality's ROW specifications for hard surface potholing (county, state, and federal) and insight on base layer compaction to maintain the surface

integrity when boring. Contractor shall restore hard surfaces in accordance with the requirements of the governing municipality.

Conduit Compliance

Installed conduit shall be "Slug Tested": Prior to invoicing for a given segment, Contractor shall certify that a non-compressible ball, having as its diameter a minimum of 80% of the conduit diameter, has been pulled or blown from handhole to handhole to verify duct is not collapsed or otherwise compromised, and that depth of cover is 36" or greater, except where required by local regulations to be at different depth, or within 24" of a handhole or other access location.

Responses to Questions Submitted by Contractors

Question #1

- What is the depth of cover required for placement of direct buried cable and conduits?
- Will warning tape be required above any direct buried cable?

Response #1

- Standard depth of cover should be at least 36". Road crossing standard depth of cover shall be 60". Some municipalities may require deviations from this depth standard; specific depth details will be confirmed prior to a segment being added to the Contiguous Segment List, with any deviations from standard called out explicitly to Contractor.
- No warning tape is required.

Question #2

What time are bids due?

Response #2

Bids are due by 1:00 PM CST on February 10th, 2025.

Question #3

- There are gray/white conduits on the KMZ. Are those a part of the construction bid? If not, are they already in place and will they be used for fiber placement.
- In Appendix A. What do OFM and CFM stand for?

Response #3

- The gray/white conduits are existing conduit and fiber. These are not a part of this RFP.
- OFM is Owner Furnished Material
- CFM is Contractor Furnished Material

Question #4

- What gauge or type tracer wire are you requiring?
- Is the contractor supplying couplers?
- If we are supplying couplers is there a specific type?

Response #4

- Tracer wire shall be 12 AWG and rated for direct bury use. Tracer wire must be insulated and meet the following standards: ASTM B910,B170,D1248._Tracer wire shall be bored/trenched/plowed in entire duct system and with direct buried fiber._

- The contractor is supplying couplers. There is no specific type of coupler required, but they must be air-tight to 215PSI to support blown fiber installation. All couplings not specified on the plans must be approved by Finley Engineering and explicitly called out

Question #8

 What is the % of subcontractors that can work on this project and/or can the 90% of IL residents be subcontractors if there is no limit on subcontractors?

Response #8

- There is no restriction on the number of subcontractors which can be used on this project; while Volo has not established a percentage of the work to be completed by the Contractor, Volo prefers proposals with the Prime Contractor completing a significant portion of the work and proposals which include proposed subcontractors as part of the proposal response.
- As noted on Page 10 of the Volo RFP for FTTH Outside Plant (OSP) Fiber Construction, it is
 the responsibility of the Contractor to understand all the requirements of Employment of
 Illinois Workers on Public Works Act (30 ILCS 570/0.01 et seq.).

Question #9

- What are the landscape restoration requirements?
- Who is responsible for providing landscape restoration materials?

Response #9

- The contractor is responsible for returning all landscaping to acceptable condition in accordance with IDOT standards, or other standards to be negotiated with Owner on a case-bycase basis.
- Contractor will provide any landscape restoration materials needed.

Question #10

- What are the anticipated reel sizes for duct and fiber cable.
- Where will materials be stored that are furnished by others?

Response #10

- Fiber cable no more than 20,000' reels.
- Duct no more than 12,000' reels.
- Owner furnished material will be stored in an owner-provided storage facility.
- Contractor furnished material storage is the responsibility of the contractor.

Question #11

- Is QC testing required for any concrete work related to restoration?
- If potholing is required under a paved road, is the contractor responsible for any additional restoration outside the limits of the pothole?

Response #11

Contractor will be required to restore concrete work to satisfaction of the AHJ for the concrete work (municipal inspector, highway commissioner, IDOT inspector, etc as appropriate). In some cases this may require a larger concrete excavation and/or replacement, depending on the rules of that AHJ.

Does the 90% Illinois workforce requirement include back office and project management?

Response #12

Our understanding of the requirement is that it only applies to Prevailing Wage designations, however we expect Contractor to comply with these State of IL provisions, and do not guarantee that our interpretation of them is correct.

Please include all technologies proposed for construction, placement, and delivery outlined in the proposal.
- 4. **References**: Please provide at least three (3) references where your organization has completed a construction project similar to our request. Please include each reference's name, address, phone number, email address, and a description of the work and completed dates.
